Jeff Gannon Memorial Day of Service

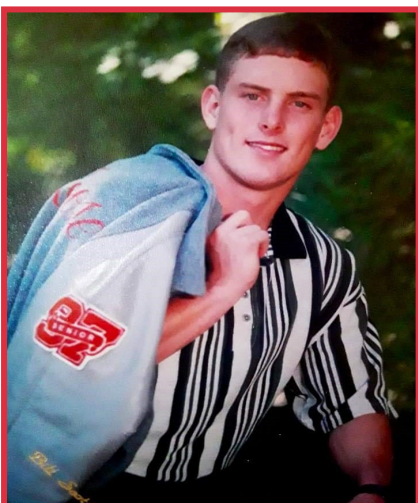
On October 8th, the APET animal shelter hosted the family and friends of Jeff Gannon, a Mineola HS graduate, who passed away on this date in 2019. His sister, Kim Gannon, wanted to do something to turn this day of sorrow and grief for his family into something other than a tragic memory. His family considered how much Jeff loved animals and decided to get a group together and donate time, goods and money in Jeff's memory to our animal shelter.

The first memorial day of service was held last year on the same date. It was a big success, with many people coming out and helping the shelter accomplish some much needed tasks. APET appreciates the friends and family of Jeff Gannon more than they know!

This year, the turnout was even better. A large group of friends and family arrived, bringing carloads of donations and equipment, to accomplish many tasks from shredding the pasture behind the shelter, to clearing brush, from mowing to trimming trees, from cleaning to grooming animals. So many tasks were completed by this wonderful group of volunteers! They hung a shade cloth over a sunny outdoor pen. They cut small saplings from a fence line and filled holes dug by dogs. They power washed buildings, serviced our air conditioners and raised nearly one thousand dollars in cash donations to benefit the shelter.

Kim is determined to grow the event as well. She has organized a volunteer group of local high school students who will start coming to the shelter on a monthly basis, and she will sponsor a scholarship for the student who volunteers the most hours to us. She is also supporting more efforts throughout the year with ad hoc project assistance and relief. We are so lucky to have Kim Gannon onboard in such a fully supportive way and APET is so appreciative of her efforts on our behalf.

On August 28th, 2021, APET's thrift store in Winnsboro, Texas, celebrated its one year anniversary. Top Dog Thrift Store opened at 300 E. Elm Street one year ago, and has been going gangbusters ever since! To help celebrate, the Dulcimer Dames were on hand to entertain with music, shoppers enjoyed delicious treats and drinks, and APET's adoption vehicle was on hand to showcase some of our adoptable animals and to demonstrate the reason the thrift stores exist - to help abandoned and neglected animals of Wood County and surrounding areas find a home,

and to help reduce the overpopulation of unwanted animals through spaying and neutering.

APET currently operates two thrift stores in Wood County. The first one, located at 909 S. Pacific Street in Mineola, opened in 2004. Both stores are packed full of great thrift items at very reasonable prices and are bursting at the seams with items for your holiday shopping. All items are donated and carefully sorted by staff and volunteers, and nothing but high quality is found on the sales floor. 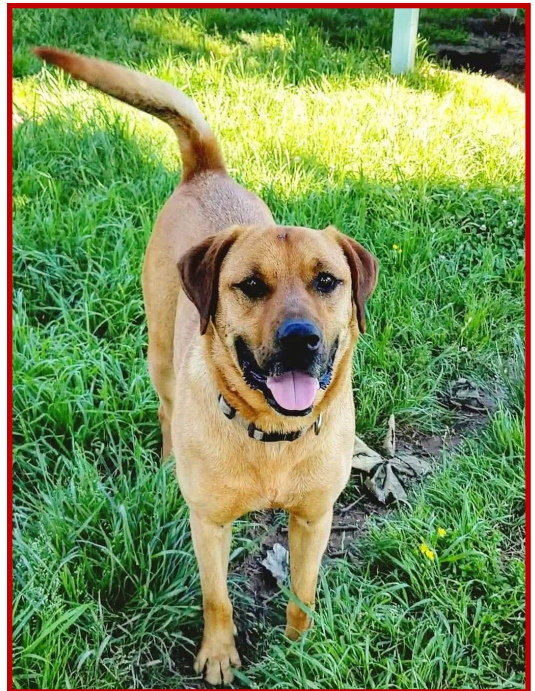

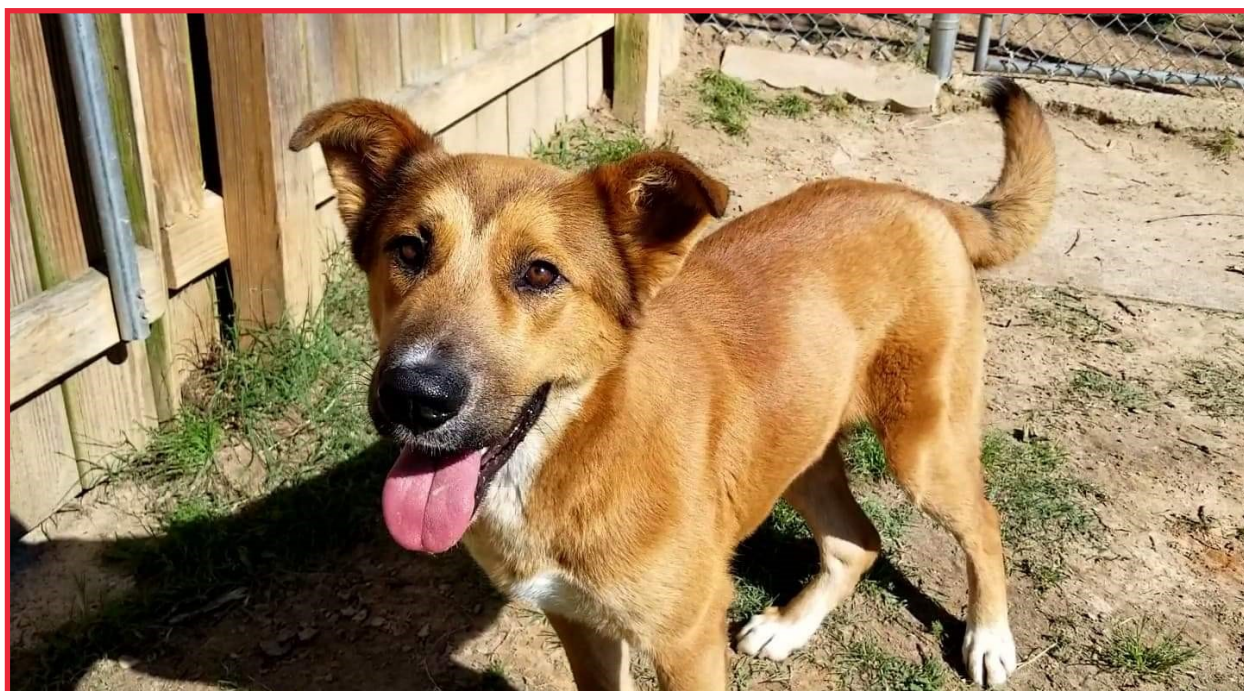

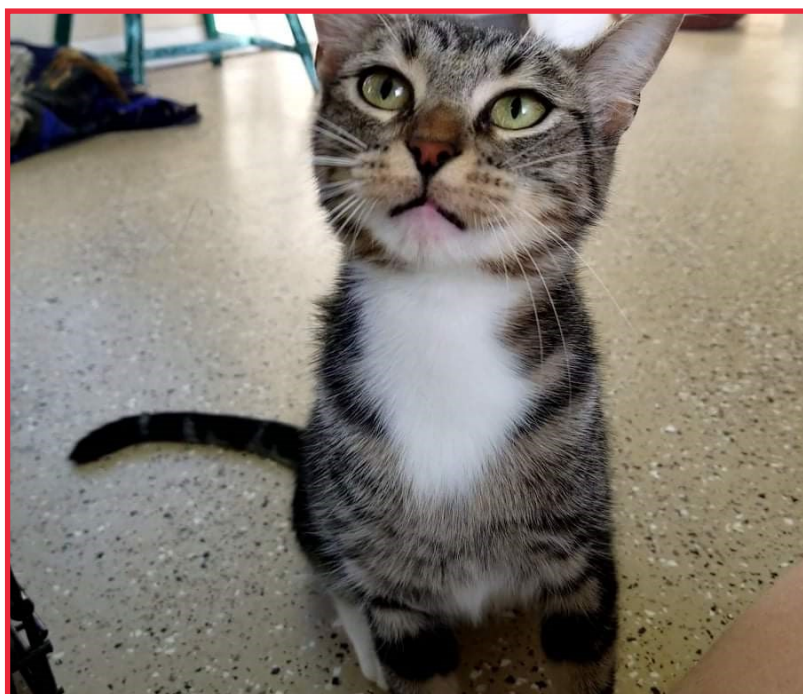

6 Fall Pet Safety Tips

1. **Beware of anti-freeze!** Ingesting anti-freeze is lethal to your pets. Both cats and dogs seem to like the taste and will lick it up. Make sure all bottles are stored away properly and that you don't have a leak in your driveway or garage from the cooling system of your auto.
2. **Beware of ticks!** It is tick season, and your pets playing in fallen leaves is a good way to get them. Make sure you are using a recommended preventative to keep them off your furry friends.
3. **Let them have a fur coat!** If you have a dog you shave down in the summer, let them grow in their winter coat. Just like you need your fall and winter coat, your dog needs theirs too!
4. **Be careful with holiday treats!** Many of the things we love, like chocolate, can be hazardous to your pet's health. No cooked bones, no raw bread dough, and many fruits and vegetables are also off limits.
5. **Be careful with holiday decorations!** Many shiny decorations are appealing to our pets. But they sometimes contain toxic metals, and can become choking hazards. Make sure to keep them out of your pet's reach.
6. **Make holiday arrangements with your pet sitter, dog walker or doggy day care now!** As the holidays approach, these people will get busier and busier, and you don't want to be caught off-guard if you need to travel for the holidays and need a place for Fido. Plan ahead!
